

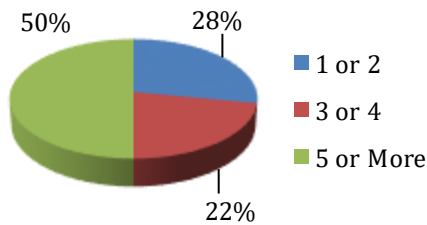

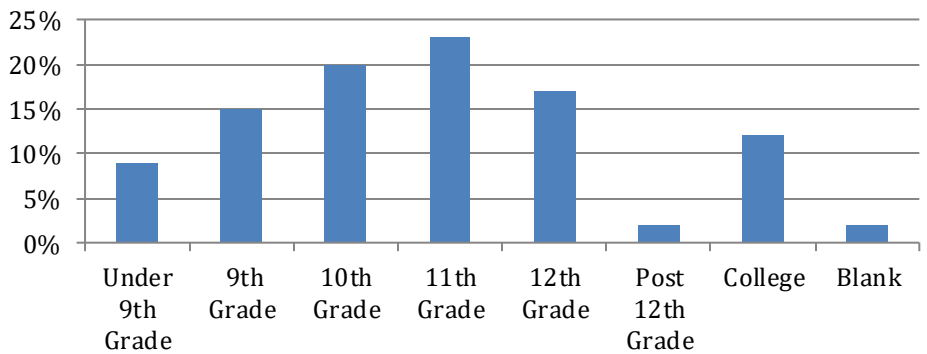

Number of services received (FY16)

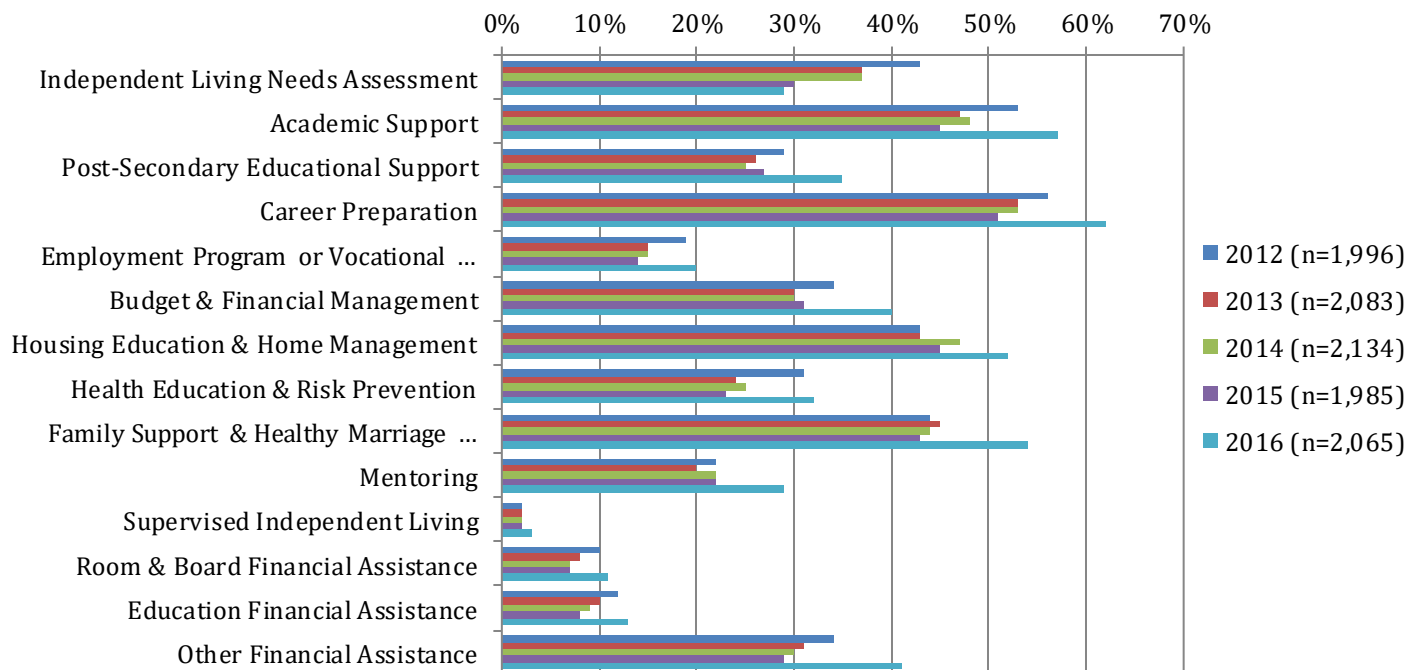


Education level of youth receiving (FY 16)

Percent of youth receiving each service (of total youth served)



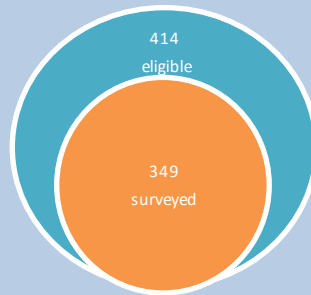

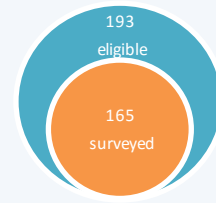
Survey participation, FY 14-16
